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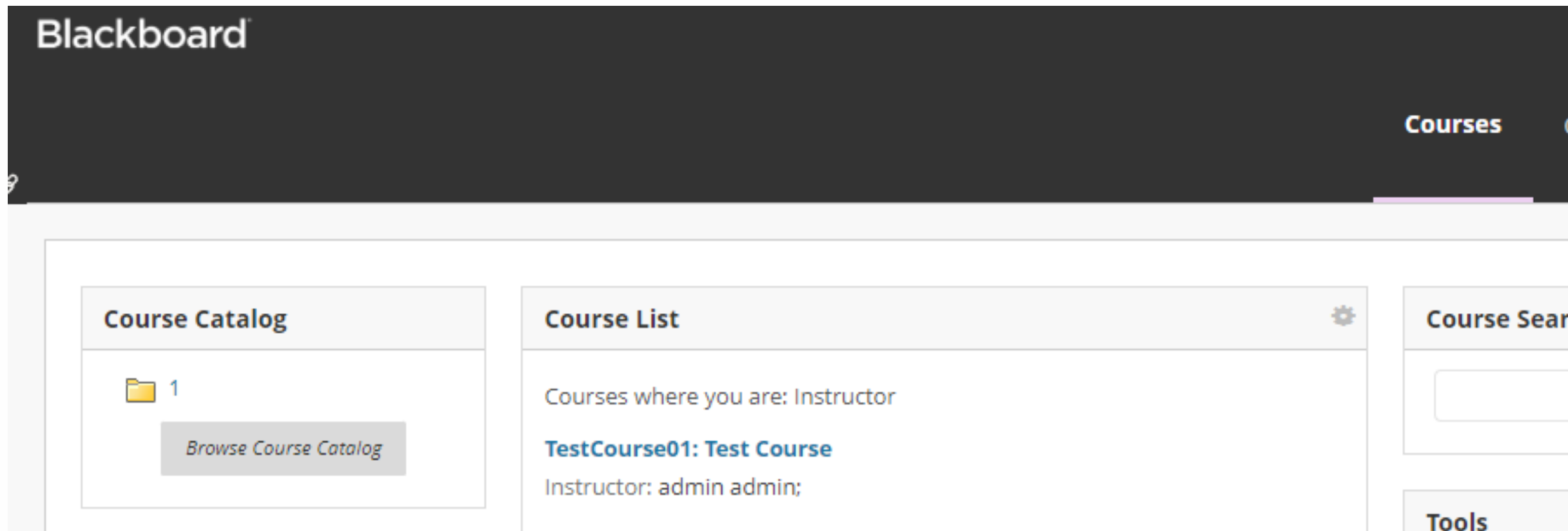
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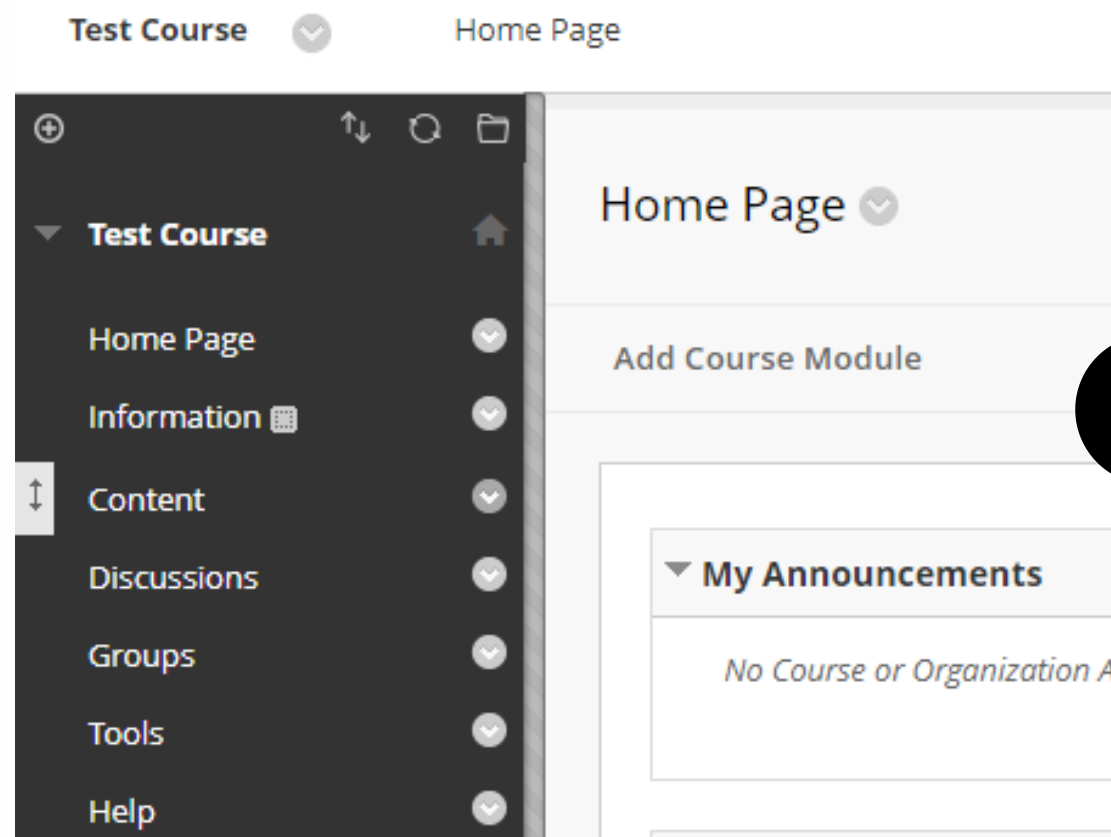
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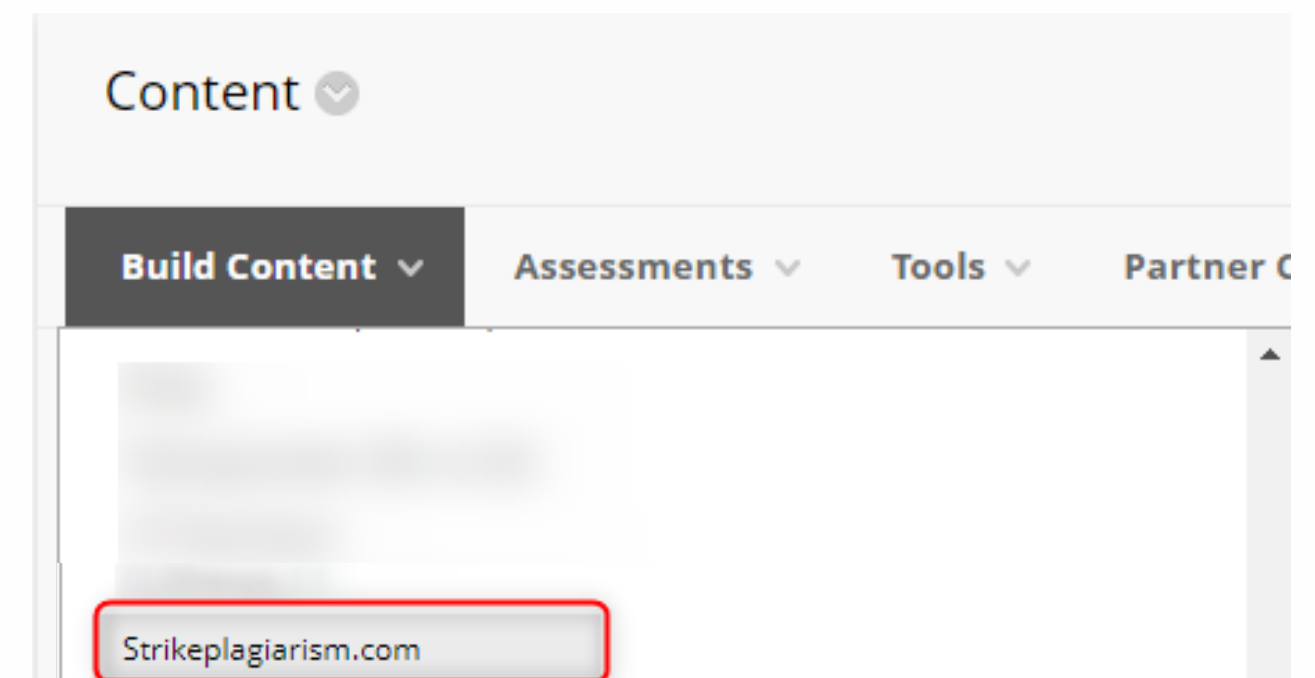

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Within academia, plagiarism by students, professors, or researchers is considered academic dishonesty or academic fraud, and offenders are subject to academic censure, up to and including expulsion. Some institutions use plagiarism detection software to uncover potential plagiarism and to deter students from plagiarizing. Some universities address the issue of academic integrity by providing students with thorough orientations, **toyota** required writing courses, and clearly articulated honor codes. Indeed, there is a virtually uniform understanding among college students that plagiarism is wrong. "Nevertheless, each year students are brought to their institutions' disciplinary boards on charges that they have misused sources and try to cheat in their schoolwork." [23]

However, the practice of plagiarizing by use of sufficient word substitutions to exclude detection software, a known as rogeting, has rapidly evolved as students and unethical academics seek to stay ahead of detection software. [24]

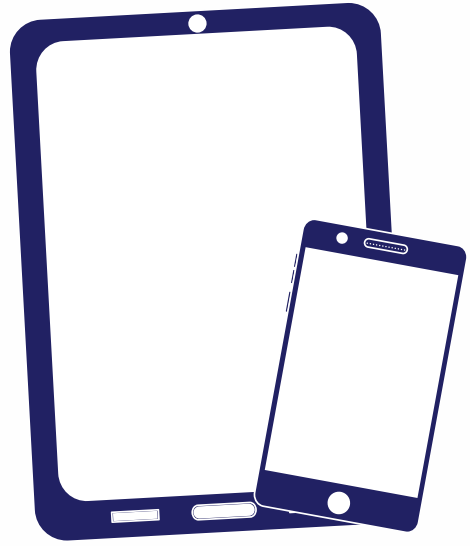
